Karnataka Evaluation Authority held on 20-01-2022**


The Chief Evaluation Officer, KEA and Member Secretary of the Technical Committee welcomed the Chairperson and members of the Technical Committee.

Elaborate the sampling framework including information on selection of the last unit of sample (i.e farmer) 4. Give Clarity in tables with regard to estimation of averages. 5. Incremental changes (increase or decrease) are huge in few impact tables and hence rechecking required for its correctness and appropriateness. 6. Suggest measures to improve animal health and scaling up of best practices in the recommendations. Include recommendations coming from the results of the current study.
