


## Action Taken Report for the recommendations made by M/s. Karnataka Evaluation Authority.

Sl. No.	Recommendations	Action Taken
1.	The hiring of machines and equipment should be offered to marginal and small farmers, in general and SC / ST farmers on priority at the rates lower than market rates. CHSCs need to be financially compensated by the Government to cover the difference between offered hire rates and market rates.	There is no provision to pay hiring charges in the CHSC guidelines, as Government is already paying the 70% subsidy to the machineries shelved in the CHSC.
2.	CHSCs should be permitted to serve as one stop centre to market farm-related inputs viz., seeds, fertilisers, plant protection chemicals as well as facilitating marketing and processing (value addition) of agricultural produce as a part of diversified activities.	To serve CHSC as one stop centre for all the farm related inputs a proposal has been sent to the Government for necessary Order. A suitable guideline will be issued to shelve the machineries required for Processing and Value addition along with facilitating Marketing of Farm related inputs as per the awaited Government Order.
3.	Plant protection equipment (hand operated) should be deleted from the list of equipment to be stocked.	A suitable guideline will be issued for deleting / dropping the shelving of hand operated PP equipments.
4.	Department should popularise the use of equipment and their availability at CHSC.	It's already being done.
5.	DIC should fix the hire charges based on fuel prices, labour wages, rent and depreciation once a year.	It's already being done.

6.	Service providers should be encouraged to establish CHSC in every hobli – duly considering the maximum distance between any CHSC and village should not be more than 10 Km to reduce the overhead cost of transportation. Alternatively, machinery could be stored at villages which are more than 10 km after consolidating the requirement to reduce the transportation cost.	As per the Government Order, one CHSC shall be established in all the hoblis. However, the District committee may take decision to establish the CHSC anywhere within that hobli which is suitable. Further, Department has taken action to establish the Farm Machinery Banks at Village / Gram Panchayath level. These centres can also work in co-ordination with CHSC. A suitable circular will be issued after the discussion and proposals from the CHSCs, so that more co-ordination can be established between village level Farm Machinery Banks and CHSCs. A separate Guidelines will be issued to shelve the equipments in the needy villages from CHSC.
7.	The list of equipment / machinery should be finalised before submitting to DIC, every year based on scientific demand analysis.	It's already being done.
8.	CHSC should be declared as the nodal agency to encourage the local farmers to hire out their private machinery and equipment.	A suitable circular will be issued for implementation of aggregator model to encourage the local farmers to hire out their private machinery & equipment through CHSCs.
9.	Government should provide required infrastructure and housing facilities in Raita Samparka Kendras or Department farms for safe storage of machinery.	There is no provision to provide required infrastructure and housing facilities in Raita Samparka Kendras or Department farms for safe storage of machinery. However, for each and every CHSC one time assistance of Rs.1.50 Lakhs as administrative cost is being given.

10.	A provision of Rs. 1.00 lakh / centre annually is to be provided to meet repair and other expenses.	A proposal has been submitted to Government to provide subsidy to meet the repair and other expenses in the turn over subsidy in the CHSC itself.
11.	An administrative grant of Rs.1.50 lakhs to establish the centres may also be provided to centres established under Slab-I (established in 2014-15) on par with the centres established in Slab-II subsequently.	A proposal has been submitted to Government to sanction administrative grant of Rs.1.50 lakhs for the centres which are established before issue of GO (ie., for the centres which were established before 2017-18).
12.	In line with the guidelines, the officers of Department of Agriculture (concerned ADA and JDA) should frequently visit CHSCs and monitor / review all the activities CHSCs under their jurisdiction.	It's already being done.
13.	A minimum permanent staff for each CHSC should be - Manager, Computer operator, Group-D worker and Driver on contract basis, besides provision to the additional drivers- depending on the necessity in season.	In the EoI and MoU it is mentioned to maintain the minimum staff. However, a circular will be issued to all the concerned to maintain the minimum permanent staff for each CHSC - Manager, Computer operator, Group-D worker and Driver on contract basis, besides provision to the additional drivers- depending on the necessity in season.
14.	The ownership of the machinery and equipment should rest with CHSC after the life period of concerned machinery / equipment.	As per the circular issued the ownership of the machinery and equipment rest with the Department as the Government is providing 70% subsidy.
15.	Training on the use of machinery needs to be conducted at the extension centres of Agriculture Department.	It's already being done.

16.	A farmer friendly App needs to be developed for better service delivery and information dissemination to achieve the effectiveness of services.	An exclusive app namely 'FARMS' developed from GoI is under use and all the operational centres are registered under this App.
17.	To cover more farmers in the service area there is need to conduct more awareness campaigns, field demonstrations, publicity through village wall posters, mass media newspapers and local Self-Help groups (SHG) for better access to CHSC benefits.	It's being done in the field at hobli, taluka and district level through various training programmes conducted by the Department. Further publicity as well as awareness has also been created through 'Phone inn Programme' and other programmes through Doordharshan (DD) and All India Radio (AIR).
18.	It is necessary to switch to sustainable CHSC model (See Fig 12.2) from the existing model (See Fig 12.1).	A detailed discussion will be arranged to sustainable CHSC model in due course and a proposal will be submitted to the Government accordingly.
19.	Approval of the list of equipment/ machineries including their number every year should be based on the demand survey and analysis. It will help in revising the inventory of CHSC in tune with changes in the demand.	It's already being done.
20.	The back-end subsidy should be released to the supplier only after physical verification of supplied items by the concerned Asst. Director of Agriculture.	It's already being done.
