


1. **Title of the project:** Evaluation of Health Coverage Scheme to Sheep & Goats [2013-14]
2. **Department:** Animal Husbandry and Veterinary Services department
3. **Consultant Organization:** JSS Institutions Campus, Mysuru

1	Awareness programme on the implementation of the scheme Health Coverage to Sheep and Goats shall be conducted at village level through audiovisual and information Education and Communication activities.	Awareness programme on the implementation of the scheme Health Coverage to Sheep and Goats has been implemented by conducting regular one day training programme on scientific Sheep and Goat rearing. From the Year 2016-17 through-out the State 26 Mobile Ambulatory Clinics have been established exclusively for health coverage of Sheep and Goats like emergency treatments, deworming, vaccination, conducting Post mortem of deaths for releasing Exgratia to the Shepherds .	
2	Preparing calendar of events for organizing Mass Camps and conducting the same as per the schedule. Prior information about the Mass Camps shall be communicated to the villagers through tom tom.	The calendar of events for organizing Mass Deworming and Vaccination Camps is being done on priority basis by vide propaganda through leading daily News papers , distribution of pamphlets and Hand-outs.	
3	Officers of KSWDC in association with the officers of Department of Animal Husbandry and Veterinary Services are organizing Mass deworming camps. Implementing officers suggested that deworming shall be supplemented by mineral mixture. It is suggested that	As Per the recommendations of Central Wool Development Board, Jodhpur under Sheep and Wool Improvement Scheme (SWIS) regular Deworming and distribution of mineral mixture is being taken in the various Project areas of the State. Now the	

	the local SHG's / Sheep and Wool Producers Co-Operative Societies shall be trained in deworming and they shall be paid some incentive.	Scheme is implemented by the help of Department of AH&VS with the active participation of Sheep and Wool Producers Co-Operative Society members.	
4	It is observed that in most of the places the proper office infrastructure is not available. It is suggested that the officer in charge of implementing this scheme shall be provided with proper office, staff, storage facility for medicines, vehicle to attend the Mass camp.	Through-out the State KSWDCL has its own offices at 26 district head Quarters with implementing Officers ,Staff and Ambulatory Vehicles sufficient to organise and attend the mass Deworming Camps.	
5	It is suggested that based on the sheep and goats population indents has to be obtained from the district officers and planning should be made to obtain sufficient quantity of medicine required. It may be contemplated that the procurement of the medicine can be decentralized considering the pros and cons of the decentralization.	As per the Sheep and Goat population in the District the concerned implementing Officer will suggest the type of Deworming medicine on the type of Parasitic Infestations prevailing in that Area. The quantity of Deworming medicine will be supplied as per the indent placed by the implementing Officer.	
6	As per the secondary data, we understand that there is a lot of gap between demand and supply of anthelmintics. At present KSWDC could able to deworm 8% to 10% of the Sheep and Goats Population in a year. As per the analysis the total funds required to cover 100% sheep and Goats population for deworming is Rs.14,48,37,000/- as against the government release of Rs.2,00,00,000/-. There is a shortage of funds to the tune of Rs.12,48,37,000/- in the department to cover total population. The Ministry shall re-look in to this issue and release the required funds to cover 100% of the Sheep and Goats Population. This can be taken up in a phased manner by increasing the existing allocation by 20% annually so that this can be achieved in 5 years.	Anthelmintics purchased by KSWDCL during the Year 2018-19 is worth Rs 5.48 Crores which was distributed to cover the 25% of Sheep and Goat Population of the State. Hitherto KSWDCL is also in anticipation of more Funds from the State Government.	



7	At present deworming is done once or twice in a year. It is suggested that deworming to all the sheep and Goats population shall be carried out at least 4 times in a year.	Deworming to all the sheep and Goats of the State shall be carried out 4 times in a year only if the sufficient Funds are available for the purchase of deworming medicines.	
8	During our field visit we came across few sheep and wool producers cooperative societies exists, but they are inactive, effort shall be made to utilize their services for organizing mass deworming camps by paying them some incentives. The marketing network for wool products shall be made available to the societies.	565 Sheep and wool producers cooperative societies have been registered under KSWDCL and 250 societies were sanctioned one-time grant of Rs 5.00 Lakhs each. A total of 12.50 Crores has been released to the above societies.	
9	It is suggested that a stock centre has to be established at taluk level and a stock men shall be posted to take care of the medicines. His services may also be utilized during the Mass deworming camps.	Department of AH&VS is maintaining the Deworming medicines Stock and distributing the same with the help of the available Staff, and help from para-veterinary staff of the Department of AH&VS under the supervision of Veterinary officers.
